The Board Corner: Perspectives from Penny — As you know, the past few months in Fairfax County were focused on budget, as the Board of Supervisors considered the county executive's proposals for FY2018. The final budget is a disciplined one that maintains most county services, without increasing the real estate tax rate. The Board will adopt the FY2018 budget formally on Tuesday, May 2, 2017; the new budget takes effect on July 1. Drivers running stop signs and red lights create a serious, even deadly, problem in our community. Unfortunately, it is not unusual to see two, or even three, vehicles blasting through red lights at intersections, well after the light has changed to green for cross traffic. Mason Matters! The Television Show – Across the Washington Metropolitan area, gang activity has been on the rise and the tragic, horrible news of recent gang-related homicides has elevated concerns throughout the community. Although Fairfax County remains one of the safest jurisdictions in the country, gang prevention continues to be a complex task, requiring the combined efforts of law enforcement and other government agencies, schools, parents, a network of organizations, and the community at-large. Nearly 20 years ago, the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors approved funding for a dedicated gang unit in the police department, focused on the prevention, intervention, interdiction, and suppression of gang activity in the county, and educating the school system and the community about gangs, the role of parents and mentors, after-school programs, and other aspects crucial to helping youth make good decisions. After-school programs and new youth activities blossomed. Despite such ongoing efforts, gang activity continues. The May edition of Mason Matters!, the television show that brings you news and information about our Mason District community, hosted by Supervisor Penny Gross, features Ed Ryan, Gang Prevention Coordinator for Fairfax County, and Jonathan Melendez, Prevention Coordination Specialist, Fairfax County Department of Neighborhood and Community Services. Last year more than 1,000 residents attended the expo and met with dozens of job recruiters for full-time, part-time, and seasonal positions. You can also get resume assistance and attend helpful seminars.
