A few items of information for you or your association newsletter:

The Board Corner: Perspectives from Penny – It's no secret that weather has been changing. The oppressive heat of earlier this summer has been replaced by another extreme – unending rain. Storms are more frequent and more intense. Helpful tips about how to navigate in this weather, and what to watch out for, are provided by Fairfax County.

The most important thing is to stay safe. Heavy rainstorms quickly can cause local streams to overtop their banks and cause flooding of roads, yards, and structures. If you live near a stream, even a small one, please be aware of the potential for flooding. Keep children and pets away from streams during rain events. Water can rise quickly, and move everything in its path.

"Turn around; don't drown" is a simple, but easy, motto during rain events. The depth of water across the roadway, especially at night, can be impossible to ascertain. It never is safe to drive or walk through flood waters. Gunning your car's engine to get through water on the road is very dangerous. The engine can die, even a small amount of water can lift the tires off the road, and moving water will float your vehicle, leaving you with no control. If you need to back up to avoid water, then back up, and turn around. Please don't be a statistic.

Wet soil and heavy wind gusts can cause trees to uproot and fall. If a tree hits your house, get everyone out safely, and use your cell phone, outside, to call 911 for assistance. Public safety employees can assess your home for structural damage and assure that utilities are controlled. Go to a neighbor's house, or a public facility, to stay dry and out of the elements. Then, you can call your insurance company.

Prepare for power outages. Keep your devices charged; having a charging cable in your vehicle can come in handy during lengthy outages. And keep your vehicle fueled. Gas pumps don't work during a power outage. If your power goes out, be sure to report the outage to your provider. Never assume your neighbor has reported the outage. Keep a flashlight or battery-powered lantern in your emergency kit for lighting. Never use candles.

Four Fairfax County Park Authority RECenter Pools and Three Elevators to Close for Maintenance – RECenter passes are valid at all nine Park Authority RECenters, and pass holders are welcome to visit other non-impacted RECenters during maintenance cycles. RECenters will remain open during pool and elevator maintenance activities.

The pools and spas that will be affected are:

- Providence RECenter: Closes August 26 and reopens September 9
- South Run RECenter: Closes August 13 and reopens September 9
- Spring Hill RECenter: Closes August 27 and reopens September 23
- Mount Vernon RECenter: Closes August 24 and reopens September 4

Maintenance work also will be conducted on elevators at **Providence RECenter from August 27 to October 25**, at **South Run RECenter from August 13 to October 12**, and at **Spring Hill RECenter from August 27 to October 26**. Alternative routes will be identified at the Providence and Spring Hill RECenters. These dates are subject to change. Getting Around a Roundabout – Drivers on Ravensworth Road now have a new traffic pattern at the intersection of Jayhawk Street in Annandale. Construction of a new modular mini-roundabout, a pilot project with the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), was completed in collaboration with the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT). Roundabouts can effectively control speed in residential neighborhoods. Here are some things to remember when driving through roundabouts:

- You must yield to the traffic already in the roundabout.
- Use your right-turn signal as you approach the exit you wish to use.
- Always yield to pedestrians who may be crossing the road on your approach to the roundabout.
- Pedestrians, bicycle riders and motorcyclists are often hard to see, so please watch for them.

Land Use News – Land use items of interest include:

- At its **Tuesday, July 31, 2018** meeting, the Board of Supervisors will consider proposed language for a Zoning Ordinance Amendment about how to, or not, regulate Short-Term Lodging (STLs) in residential areas. Public testimony about STLs was heard by the Board at its **Tuesday, July 10** meeting.
- Northpoint Realty Partners, LLC has submitted an SE/PCA application to amend proffers and conditions associated with the approved I-4 zoning, and to permit an increase in FAR from 0.50 to 0.70 to permit a self-storage facility on a 6.04 acre property located at 6375 Bren Mar Drive. The applicant will present before the Mason District Land Use Committee on **Tuesday, September 25**.
- The Calvary Church of the Nazarene, located 8220 Little River Turnpike in Annandale, has submitted an SE application for an adult day care center. The facility is proposed to be located entirely within the church's existing structure and proposes no changes or additions to the exterior of the property. The Mason District Land Use Committee considered this application at its **July 24 meeting**.

Also on display is a collection of portrait drawings by students in an Inmate Re-entry Program at the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center. Under the volunteer instruction of Kelli Schollard-Sincock, who developed her art curriculum under the name "Inspiration Matterz" in 2017, students worked from provided photographs, and used a step-by-step pencil drawing process with a gridding system to teach the basics of observation and interpretation.
