### **REMINDERS FROM THE BOARD**

- ✓ Quarterly Assessments are due January 1, April 1, July 1, and October 1. The assessment has increased slightly to \$235 (quarterly). Assessment vouchers were sent out in November with the increase notice. If you haven't received a voucher sheet, please contact the Board as soon as possible.
- ✓ We will hold our Annual Board meeting on March 14<sup>th</sup> in 2017. Additional information will be mailed to homeowners in February. We invite you all to come to meet your neighbors, exchange your ideas, and discuss upcoming community news. We hope to see you there!
- ✓ Please turn on your front and back outdoor lights. It provides extra illumination for our community and may prevent a break-in to your home or your neighbors.
- ✓ Pet owners, please be a responsible for your pets at all times and always pick up after your pets. Properly dispose of what you pick up after your dog. Place it in a trash receptacle; do not leave it on the ground by the curbside trash pick-up locations. Dog poop is not only an unsightly, smelly waste, but it's toxic! Remember, being a good neighbor and resident of our community means doing your part to keep our sidewalks and common areas clean and safe.
- ✓ With winter comes the potential for snow, and we've certainly seen our fair share over the years. Please remember to clear your sidewalks; and if you can, lend a helping hand to your fellow neighbors and help them too. Also, if you can, lend a hand and shovel snow away from fire hydrants, drains, and mailboxes.

## **PARKING IN LEEWOOD**

One of the most discussed topics at meetings and among neighbors is parking in our community. We hear your concerns and have thought about how we might be able to address this. We are open to your ideas and feedback- please share! In the meantime, we ask each of you to consider your (and your visitors) parking options and actions in our neighborhood.



Each lot (townhome) is provided one reserved space and the remaining unreserved spots are up for grabs. Many residents are using more than their *fair share* of unreserved spaces. Yes, the unreserved spaces are open for all, but keep in mind that neighbors have a right to park and if you are taking more than three spaces, you are not being a considerate neighbor. Extra parking is available on Bradwood Street and the service road of Braddock.



Each homeowner has a reserved parking space with the owner's lot number painted on it, and all unmarked are considered unreserved. Please ask guests, vendors, contractors, and other visitors to park in an unmarked space. Parking in another homeowner's reserved space is not considerate and may result in immediate towing of the vehicle.



The Board recommends that all homeowners read the Association parking rules and regulations (available on the website).

# Winter/Holiday Service Schedule

#### Dear Valued Customer,

Happy Holidays! As we enter the busy Holiday season, we would like to remind you of the upcoming collection schedule and inclement weather policies.

Christmas Day & New Year's Day: Falls on a Sunday this year. There will be no interruption in your service.

**Yard Debris Collection:** Yard debris collection ends effective January 11th unless your contract specifies otherwise. If you have yard debris to be collected after this date, place your items curbside on your 2nd collection day of the week until the season resumes the 1st week of March.

**Christmas Tree Collection:** Christmas trees will be collected on January 4th and 11th. We ask that all tinsel and decorations be removed. Please do not place trees in plastic bags.

**Inclement Weather:** Safety in your community is our primary concern. Roads and/or areas, which are deemed unsafe due to snow or ice will be suspended for collection. If we are unable to provide collection, services will resume on the next regularly scheduled collection day. Be on the lookout for the red alert bar on our website to see if service will be affected due to inclement weather.
